2. **No entries will be taken by telephone.**
3. All Exhibits must be staged on the Show Field by 10 a.m. on the morning of the Show, and **must be re-claimed between 4.30 p.m. and 5.30 p.m.**
4. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR.
5. NO EXHIBIT ALLOWED WHICH HAS PREVIOUSLY WON A PRIZE AT KESWICK AGRICULTURAL SHOW.
6. More than one entry per person in any one class, only one prize allowed. This rule does not apply to Section 6-Honey.
7. The Judges shall have power of withholding prizes in every case where there shall not appear sufficient merit.
8. The Judges Decision is Final. No correspondence entered into.
9. Every care will be taken to safeguard exhibits, but the Society undertakes no liability. Entries are only accepted on this condition.
10. Prize money must be collected in the tent from the Secretary between 4.30 p.m. and 5.30 p.m.
11. The Committee reserves the right to cancel any classes if there are insufficient entries to judge. Exhibitors will be notified before the date of the Show.

OPEN TO ALL BEEKEEPERS

- 2- All comb honey to be properly protected by glass or cellophane wrapping.
- 3- Extracted honey must be exhibited in Ministry of Agriculture pattern 1 lb. squat jars with standard commercial screw tops and finishes, apart from displays.
- 4- The Judges shall be empowered to withhold any prize in case of insufficient merit or entries.
- 5- An Exhibit or part thereof is not to be removed until the close of the Show. No exhibit may be tasted or in any way interfered with by the exhibitor or any person during the Show without the authority of the Show Committee.
- 6- All exhibits must be staged before 10 a.m. on Show Day.
- 7- Entries close on Friday 12th August, 2005.
- 8- To complete for the Presidents Prize, competitors with more than one prize in a class, only their highest placed points will be used.
